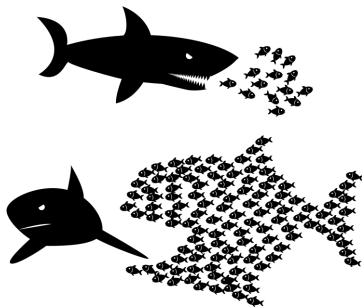

OCCTA Howard Fenner Scholarships

HOWARD FENNER SCHOLARSHIPS are outright grants to graduating high school seniors who are children of members of the Orange County Classroom Teachers Association and who can demonstrate a genuine need for financial assistance.

A MINIMUM OF \$30,100 IN SCHOLARSHIPS WILL BE AWARDED

To qualify for the grant, an applicant must:

1. Be a child of a member of the Orange County Classroom Teachers Association.
2. Possess high overall qualifications, including character, scholarship, and demonstration of financial need.
3. Submit a timely application accompanied by letters of recommendation.
4. Be eligible for graduation from an accredited high school (includes students who qualify for early admission to college and meet all other qualifications).

High school counselors have been informed that these scholarships are available.

****Please Note**: Failure to provide any of the below could disqualify applicants.**

A. Official Transcript

An OFFICIAL transcript of school grades through the first semester of the current year must be submitted, to include UNWEIGHTED cumulative grade point average and class standing for grades 9 - 1st semester 12th. **ONLY an official transcript will be accepted.** It must be signed by the registrar or counselor. This document cannot be an academic involvement report or subject/grade printout.

B. Copy of SAT and ACT scores.

C. Application Packet

The application packet is required to give more detailed information. This packet should include:

1. A 200-word essay stating the name of the school of your choice, your purpose in attending this institution and your plans after graduation. Essay must be specific to this scholarship. Please do not copy your college application essay.
2. A letter of college or career technical school acceptance.
3. A list of your extracurricular activities, both inside and outside of school, and a list of any service hours earned.
4. Plans for financing the large remainder of school expenses with any arrangements you might have for earning the money (i.e. other scholarships, grants, summer jobs, etc.)
5. An identification of extenuating circumstances to demonstrate financial need.

D. Reference Letters

One letter of academic recommendation **and one letter** of personal reference are required.

E. Other

The Scholarship Committee may require an interview with the applicant or with the high school counselor.

TO BE CONSIDERED:

A. Incomplete applications will not be considered. All information must be submitted simultaneously, including letters of reference. Please put in order A, B, C, D (2 letters), and E.

B. The completed application form and all attachments must be received in the CTA office no later than 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 23, 2023.

2022-2023 OCCTA Marion Cannon Scholarships

CTA's mission is to empower and advocate for our members in order to ensure a quality public education for every student.

This committee is charged with overseeing all aspects of the Marion Cannon Scholarship Fund, which was established to promote union leadership throughout the AFL-CIO community. The funds are used to pay for conference or professional development training expenses, including registration and related expenses. The committee will advertise the scholarship, explain the application process, accept and screen applications. The committee can also fundraise for additional funds with approval of the President and Board of Directors.

A MINIMUM OF \$5,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS WILL BE AWARDED

To qualify for the grant, an applicant must:

- 1. Be a OCCTA member.**
- 2. Be a CTA leader, aspiring CTA leader, or Teacher leader who meets eligibility requirements.**
- 3. Be seeking attendance at a conference or professional development training that enhances teacher leadership, union leadership, or union solidarity in Central Florida by helping aspiring union leaders.**

Application Deadline: 60 days prior to the conference or training date, to provide time for the Marion Cannon Committee to meet and for travel arrangements to be made.

**Travel arrangements must made by grant recipient.*

**Grant recipients must submit evidence of attendance to conference or training.*

**Granted funds must be refunded if the grant recipient is unable to attend the conference or training.*

**No person serving on the Marion Cannon Committee will be eligible for an award during the year they are serving.*
